Duration: 1 Year Candidates with at least 50% marks either in the Bachelor Degree and / or in the Master's Degree of Kurukshetra University, Maharshi Dayanand University Rohtak, CDLU, Sirsa or any other qualification recognized as equivalent thereto are eligible for admission to the programme. Shastri Degree 3-year (with or without English) Acharya Degree 2-year with 50% marks in aggregate from statutory university/Institutions.
